McEntegart dedicated the new wing of the school. Before these projects could be completed, however, Monsignor King died on July 21, 1966, after eight years of great service and accomplishment.

The church improvements begun by Monsignor King were completed by Father Charles Murphy, the new pastor. Now the parish plant was complete and the Jackson Heights neighborhood had also reached its boundaries. During the late 1950's and early 1960's, the remaining open land, heretofore used for athletic purposes, disappeared as the co-operative apartment houses were built along 34th Avenue and Northern Boulevard.

A turning point in the history of Blessed Sacrament took place during the pastorate of Father Murphy when the changes envisioned by the Second Vatican Council were
